- 1) Split Shifts for Poll Workers: How many people took advantage? Did it create problems? Would it make sense to expand it to the counting center?
- 2) Recruitment of Poll Workers? How did it go? Shortages? Training of Poll Workers? Enough Official Observers?
- 3) Election Office staff and Seasonal Hires: Same number of employees or fewer?
- 4) Budget for Office of Elections
- 5) Mail-in Balloting: More than before? Problems? Timing of delivery of ballots to voters? Ballot security procedures adequate/ any problems?
- 6) Poll Watchers in the polling places. Same number or smaller? Any interference from them? Any complaints from them?
- 7) Supply of Optical Scan Paper Ballots in Polling Places. Two years ago, there were shortages. What was done differently this year? Problems with control of ballots? Additional cost or manhours with new approach? How many wasted ballots?
- 8) Decision to Release Primary Election Results from August 9th Prior to Voting in Puna. The law and/or the logic of the decision to not hold back the results.
- 9) Puna Election
 - a) Decision to close precincts 01 & 02. Based upon what information, what criteria? Were local officials consulted?
 - b) Decision to open precincts 03 & 04. Based upon what information, what criteria? Were local officials consulted?
 - c) Inability of voters in 01 & 02 to vote on August 9th. Inability of voters from precincts 03 & 04 to vote in make-up election. Any discretion on that?
- 10) Decision to Not Use Mail-in Voting for the Two Final Puna Precincts:
 - a) Who was consulted? What was the position of the Big Island county officials? What was the rationale for shifting to onsite walk-in voting instead?
- 11) Decision to Hold the Walk-in Election on Saturday, August 16th Shifted to Friday, August 15th
 - a) Who was consulted? What was the position of the Big Island county officials? What was the rationale for shifting from Saturday to Friday?

12) Decision to use all electronic voting in the August 15th voting in Puna? Why no paper ballots? Were not the paper ballots from the cancelled Aug 9th election still available and near by? What if the electricity had failed? Wouldn't the paper option have reduced the waiting time at the polling place?

13) Maui Election Results Not Transmitted on August 9th

a) Please describe the details. Smart Card left in a Voting Machine? Optical scan? Who was responsible for transmitting the data? What are the procedures in place at the county site to ensure all voting results are transmitted and accounted for? How did those safeguards break down in this case? What are the procedures in place on Oahu in the state counting center to ensure all the voting data from remote centers has been received and tabulated? How did the state safeguards break down? Are new procedures necessary to prevent this mistake or are the current procedures adequate, but were just not followed?

b) Please describe the audit process which caught the missing votes. When is the audit performed? What aspects of the election are audited and who performs and witnesses the audit?

c) When it was discovered that the results on the card had not been transmitted and included in the vote count, were there official witnesses monitoring the cutting of the security seal, recording the number from the card, watching the transmission of the data on Maui and its receipt on Oahu? Were observers from the affected campaigns, from the political parties, from groups like the LWV present?

d) The Decision to Not Publicize the Maui Glitch Until Friday, the date of the Puna Vote? What was the rationale for the delay?

League of Women Voters of Hawaii

Chair Marston and Commission Members:

I am Janet Mason, presenting comments on behalf of the League of Women Voters of Hawaii regarding the 2014 Primary Election. You haven't heard much from us about this, because the League is a nonpartisan organization, and we did not take sides in the sometimes-partisan debate that has played out since the primary election on August 9th. We acknowledge and thank the media for their diligence in keeping the public informed of the dramatic twists and turns that have surrounded this primary.

Since we have not had the benefit of reading the Report of Operations from the Chief Elections Officer about the 2014 primary, we call upon the Election Commission to review this situation carefully, with an eye toward preventing problems in the future. Our questions include whether resources including "boots on the ground" like the Hawaii County Clerk and Civil Defense were consulted? Was the Chief Elections Officer accorded independence in emergency elections decisions as outlined in our State Constitution?

Our basic position on elections has been clear since the establishment of the League in 1920: protect the right of every citizen to vote, and encourage every citizen to vote. With the threat of a hurricane directly striking Hawaii Island on August 9, Primary Election Day, it was entirely appropriate that the Chief Elections Officer postponed certain elections on Hawaii Island. This decision was clearly intended to accommodate voters who were grappling with a natural disaster. Frankly, either a well-run absentee election or well-run in-person voting could have protected the voting rights of our Puna citizens. We don't think that postponing elections statewide was necessary. Neither do we know whether a special election was needed in more than two Puna districts, though the League did receive complaints from other districts that on August 15 it was impossible to reach their designated polling places.

Our State Constitution has served us well during this election, permitting postponement of the voting in Puna for up to 21 days from the originally scheduled date. The Chief Elections Officer faced a dilemma in scheduling the makeup election, since postponing the conclusion for a long time could have delayed preparations for the general election and opened the door for intense electioneering in the affected areas. Still, the League does not understand why scheduling the special election was rushed to an August 15 date, when up to two additional weeks could have been offered to the disaster-stricken area. In the future we hope more time would be permitted for voters to recover from natural disasters to vote. A longer lead time would ease any road



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closures that make it difficult to travel to polling places or make it easier for absentee ballots to be delivered to voters. We think this is both compassionate and promotes higher voter turnout.

Like many voters, we were left confused about why the vote by mail arrangement announced August 9 and 10 for Keonepoko Elementary and Hawaiian Paradise Park Community Center was changed on August 12 to be in-person voting on August 15 at a single polling place, Keonepoko Elementary. We believe a consistent message best alerts voters about any change in election plans. We say this respecting the fact that Judge Greg Nakamura later rejected a request to halt the walk-in special election held August 15. Presumably granting a restraining order to halt the August 15 election would have resulted in further confusion for voters.

So the primary election *is* over. It was important to people in the affected Puna districts for all their elections: (County, State and Federal), but we sincerely think a well-run, fair election is important to anyone who cares about making democracy work. Obviously, adequate notice of election plans is important.

Regarding the 800 absentee ballots from Maui described as "not counted or transmitted," we say "yes" to continued post-election audits, and we say "yes" to earlier reconciliation of ballots transmitted and votes counted. When elections officials become aware of such problems, tell the public as soon as possible.

Our vision of elections administration in Hawaii includes an active Elections Commission with sufficient resources to hold the Chief Elections Officer accountable for decisions. This is why in 2013 we called for passage of SB 853, which would have specifically provided for oversight of the Chief Elections Officer. Oversight does not mean supervising the Chief Elections Officer on a day-to-day basis, but oversight means the Commission would provide general supervision of the Chief Elections Officer, and (importantly) be able to advise the Chief Elections Officer when difficult judgments are required. In our opinion, this would permit citizen representatives to weigh in on plans for elections before they occur, and would also provide a more adequate and fair basis for appraisal of the work of the Chief Election Officer than the less frequent review conducted after the elections.

Going forward, the League renews our call for simplifying elections administration by moving from the current hybrid of in-person voting and voting by mail. Our strong preference is for voting by mail statewide, with allowance for voting in person at a limited number of early voting walk-in centers.

I have been extremely disturbed at how the primary election was handled. This was also a County election, and a very important one. It is to Hawai'i's residents' detriment that we do not have local towns or school and library boards. Thus, my County Council representative is the **only** representative I have to whom I can address my concerns about police, roads, permits, environment, etc. The list can be extensive as it refers to everything local. One representative is my interface with local government. While this simplifies things, that person is the interface for thousands of others as well, with hundreds of issues.

Can County officials can make their own decision about how to conduct County Council election? Given that this a critical position for Puna residents to fill, I would like to suggest that at least this part of the election simply be re-scheduled for the general election in November.

It is so very obvious that, as it stands, many hundreds of potential voters were disenfranchised August 9 by storm devastation caused by invasive species that our government does nothing to stop or address. This cannot be allowed to stand. A local election for local people needs to be held. Please respect us at least that much.

To Chair Marston and All Committee Members,

Some if the residents of Precinct 04 04 in Puna District were impacted with a double set of negative occurrences the night of 8/7/2014.

- 1 Hurricane Eselle around 6:pm began to cross over the Big Island of Hawaii, primarily in Puna District.
- 2 The uncontrolled release of Hydrogen Sulfide Gas was released in the lower Puna area.

These residents living near Puna Geothermal Venture, PGV, suffering from the damaging high winds and rain were also poisoned by the severe amount of H2O uncontrolled release around 7:30 pm. Some of these residents experienced severe reactions to the H2 release.

Michael Hale was rendered unconscious for 12 hours and then it took a half an hour for Mr Hale to fully regain himself in an awake state.

Please refer to the video of the 8/14/2014 Puna Pono Alliance Meeting of many residents seriously affected by the H2O gas giving their testimony to PPA ,including Bob Preticci, President of PPA, Tom Travis, Vice President of PPA and Harry Kim, attending that Meeting.

This video is in UTube. These residents of the PGV area were immobilized by Eselle and the H2O gas release and certainly could not attend the Primary Election of 8/9/2014 at Precinct 04 04 in Pahoah High School Cafeteria because of an Act of Nature, Eselle and an act of man, PGV uncontrolled H2O release.

Further at approximately 8am, 8/8/2014 there was a Civil Defense Message via radio asking people to stay off of the roads unless absolutely necessary, in order to allow debris clean up and electric company crew to put things back in order. There was severe debris from very large trees all over the highways.

While the highways were virtually clear by 8/9/2014, the many connector roads of the subdivisions were impassable that Primary Day due to albizia trees down everywhere, including in residents properties making travel to the polls impossible to all of the Precincts in Puna District of Precincts 04 01, 04 02, 04 03 and 04 04.

All of these precincts should have been closed to let all of the qualified voter have a chance to recover and secure their homes and fetch emergence water, ice food and tarps provided by Hawaii County and private sources.

Precincts 1 and 2 were not open 8/9/2014 because they did have any electric . Precincts 3 and 4 did have electric and were open 8/9/2014. Precincts 3 and 4 should have then been reopened in Pahoah, 8/15/2014 in order to accommodate the qualified voters of these two Precincts that could not arrive there 8/9/2014 because of Eselle Storm and H2O gas release of PGV, and included in the Continuance of Primary Voting of 8/15/2014 when Precincts 1 and 2 were open, both Precincts 1 and 2 consolidated in Precinct 2 Keonepoko School, Hawaiian Beaches.

State of Office of Elections refused to let all of these Qualified Voters of Precincts 3 and 4 vote in the 8/15/2014 Primary Continuance of 8/15/2014. These disenfranchised qualified Voters must be given the opportunity to vote in the 2014 Primary Election in Puna Hawaii.

REVISED TESTIMONY: Elections Department Leadership in Recent Primary

Elections Commissioners:

I have edited this letter for clarity as the original was dictated in an iPhone and editing is difficult.

I have grave concerns about the way the recent primary election was conducted on the Island Of Hawaii. They are two fold, on opposite ends of the Island, Puna and Kohala. Decisive leadership and management of formal procedures seem lacking.

1. The Puna Precincts

State Office of Elections, in Honolulu, with telephone consultations, and without seeing the coordination underway to help devastated areas As far north as Honokaa and most of the East and South parts of our Island were devastated or without power and water. I have friends still in one of the most damaged area and we finally sent someone to find them and be sure they were okay, just a few days ago. It was possible to fly in, direct to Hilo! In hindsight, possibly more precincts should have been closed, given that many people had severe trouble getting out of their homes and driveways that first day, as was documented in initial assessments. Many roads were piled high and packed solid with trees and tree limbs and electrical wires. That should factor in future the open/close decisions.

Because the polling place is fine does not mean registered voters can get to it.

Put those slippahs on the ground here before making decisions, if possible. People on Oahu have taken photos of "the hurricane" and put them on the internet. Pretty much any stormy day. Here, the pictures tell a far different story.

Not everyone can hear you! Changing announcements make it difficult for them to know where,when and how to vote. Please understand, as of now, August 20, 2014, we are *still* getting at least hourly updates via radio from Civil Defense on the status of road and electrical repairs, where to take showers, get water, and so forth. Many residents spent their first several days in **exhausting** rounds of clearing their roads, finding ice and water, sleeping on the floors of shelters, keeping babies, kids and adults borderline hygienic. Tonight **1,100 HelCo customers are still without power** as the crews slog their way tangles of power lines and trees. Be aware that undamaged catchment systems, cannot work without water any more than a pump on a well can. A key cell phone tower was down and is now running on generator. Some people don't even have cell reception. People with emergency radios, went through all their batteries and now need more. Medicines that needed to be kept chilled could not be, and spoiled. Food that might have been cooked on a grill our outdoor stove spoiled in freezers and refrigerators.

Yet people want to vote, despite the hardships. As things became better, many wanted it "over with." After first hearing they would vote absentee, they then heard about the combined polling places new location. Mainly by seeing a sign on the building if they happened to drive by. Given so many were still without any means of communicating on a regular basis, except by the coconut grapevine, or a car radio on their rugged trip to get ice, even with the eagerness to vote, **many people on this island wonder**

Hello, Senator:

Here is my Letter to the Editor of the Tribune-Herald which I'm not sure will be printed. But I wanted you to know how I feel. I now realize that you, too, were trying to inject some justice into this broken voting system and I thank you for that. For the record, I did vote for Dr Lozano and wonder whether he would have won had the election been run in an inclusive manner (I believe he resonated best with the people of Puna and had solid and positive ideas to lead us). The phrases "travesty of justice" and "slap in the face" were also bandied about the Keonepoko polls.

"It didn't have to be so hard. When the election officials knew a hurricane was coming for a direct hit and there was an election scheduled two days later, absentee ballots should have been mailed to all voters on Hawai'i Island who did not already vote early. End of story. I was a precinct official at Keonepoko on Friday, where posters on the wall depicting the Statue of Liberty with the words "with liberty and justice for all" mocked all who came in the door to try to vote and were turned away. Nanawale residents have been isolated until August 10th night, yet were turned away and disenfranchised - an entire subdivision! How many other citizens were not able to get to their polling place on August 9th? There were many angry voters, some walking away when they couldn't vote on a paper ballot. Thank you to Colleen Hanabusa for bringing the lawsuit to try to stop this travesty of justice, and to Judge Nakamura for his kind words and appreciation for the situation of people in survival mode. "Let's see, shall I stand in a voting line for 1 1/2 hours" (since not enough voting machines were brought in for HPP at the beginning) "or shall I go try to find showers, ice, drinking water, and food for my family before it gets dark since we still don't have power?" What kind of choice is that? This is what Brian Schatz calls "the election officials know best?" Shame on Rex Quidilla saying they wanted to open a polling place after all, changing from the publicized decision to send absentee ballots, to "wrap up the election more quickly." What about ensuring that the greatest number of citizens can vote?"

Aloha Senator Ruderman,

My name is Drew Kapp, and I'm one of your constituents in Puna mauka. I live the upper part of Fern Forest, not too far from Volcano. I teach geography (which focuses on environment and society, and includes climate and hazards) at the University of Hawai'i at Hilo and Hawai'i Community College, am knowledgeable about our cultural and social environment of our island and the district of Puna, and I keep up with current affairs and events.

I appreciate very much the stance that you've taken with regards to the primary election fiasco in Puna, based on what I've read in the *Hawai'i Tribune-Herald*.

I'm angered by the continuing marginalization of voters in Puna (and Ka'u), and the confusing scenario created by the State Office of Elections following Hurricane/Tropical Storm Iselle that ultimately disenfranchised many voters of our area. It's very clear that many, many voters in Puna (and perhaps Ka'u) did not have the chance to cast their ballots on primary election day, rendering the primary election results incomplete - which is a serious problem, and one that ought to be more clearly and publicly addressed by our election officials.

If I had not voted in advance (walk-in, in Hilo), it is very likely I would have not been able to vote on primary election day, unable to reach my polling station - and I live quite far from those precincts whose polling stations were closed on that day. I suspect many people throughout our district - whether in Puna makai or Puna mauka (as well as in Ka'u) - were not in a position to reach a polling station, and were definitely not focused on voting, but rather on survival and dealing with the storm's aftermath. I cannot understand why the State Office of Elections chose to close only two of our island's polling stations, giving only voters of those two districts a chance to vote later. This seems to reflect a high level of insensitivity and lack of awareness of an "on-the-ground" reality on the part of election officials

And I find it offensive that the Office of Elections would consider it appropriate to require voters from Hawaiian Beaches/Shores and Hawai'i Paradise Park to set aside their recovery efforts, make their way to the Keonepoko polling station somehow, and cast their votes within less than a week of the storm. Some of our state's residents who live in the most challenging socio-economic conditions every day are among those who have been severely affected by this storm, and, I would argue, effectively deprived of the right to vote. This is hewa, and it does a great disservice to the people of the remarkable district of Puna.

I waited, called again after not receiving it and they told me it was sent to my old address and returned. They told me I would have to come down in person and vote. I was unable to because of my disability and not having transportation. I asked why they had my change of address for voter registration in their computer but sent my ballot to my old address. She told me it was their fault they had not entered the info. into the computer for mail out ballot, but would fix it, they did have my new correct address on file. I asked if mine was an isolated case or if this had happened to others? She told me mine was not an isolated case, that this happened to many other voters and they were very sorry. I am irate!!! How many of us voters were ripped off of our right to vote because of their mistake? There is no excuse. Whomever was responsible for this should be fired and there should be a re-election! Please bring this up at the hearing and look further into this matter. Thank-You

I live in Hilo and wanted to make a comment about Mr. Nago. I was to be an precinct official --responsible to train others--and attended a training in June that Mr. Nago conducted in Hilo.

I am a retired DOE teacher and have attended many such trainings-- and I personally told him that I learned nothing because he hurried through the presentation and was not able to satisfactorily answer questions. He did not know the answer to even the most basic of questions.

I told him privately how poorly the session met the needs of the audience, and he merely lifted his shoulders and pretty much didn't care.

He really didn't know the material and his poor, couldn't care less attitude was a complete turn off.

I told him that now I understand why the elections board has a hard time recruiting personnel if that is the attitude of the administration.

I gave him back his training materials and walked out.

I contacted Pat Nakamoto on 6/15 and let her know of my frustrations and that I would not serve as a trainer because of the poor quality of the training that was offered. She indicated how difficult it was to recruit personnel and said that she would pass my comments along to officials in Honolulu.

To Chair Marston and All Committee Members,

Some of the residents of Precinct 04 04 in Puna District were impacted with a double set of negative occurrences the night of 8/7/2014.

- 1 Hurricane Eselle around 6:pm began to cross over the Big Island of Hawaii, primarily in Puna District.
- 2 The uncontrolled release of Hydrogen Sulfide Gas was released in the lower Puna area.

These residents living near Puna Geothermal Venture, PGV, suffering from the damaging high winds and rain were also poisoned by the severe amount of H2O uncontrolled release around 7:30 pm. Some of these residents experienced severe reactions to the H2 release.

Michael Hale was rendered unconscious for 12 hours and then it took a half an hour for Mr Hale to fully regain himself in an awake state.

Please refer to the video of the 8/14/2014 Puna Pono Alliance Meeting of many residents seriously affected by the H2O gas giving their testimony to PPA ,including Bob Preticci, President of PPA, Tom Travis, Vice President of PPA and Harry Kim, attending that Meeting.

This video is in UTube. These residents of the PGV area were immobilized by Eselle and the H2O gas release and certainly could not attend the Primary Election of 8/9/2014 at Precinct 04 04 in Pahoia High School Cafeteria because of an Act of Nature, Eselle and an act of man, PGV uncontrolled H2O release.

Further at approximately 8am, 8/8/2014 there was a Civil Defense Message via radio asking people to stay off of the roads unless absolutely necessary, in order to allow debris clean up and electric company crew to put things back in order. There was severe debris from very large trees all over the highways.

While the highways were virtually clear by 8/9/2014, the many connector roads of the subdivisions were impassable that Primary Day due to albizia trees down everywhere, including in residents properties making travel to the polls impossible to all of the Precincts in Puna District of Precincts 04 01, 04 02, 04 03 and 04 04.

All of these precincts should have been closed to let all of the qualified voter have a chance to recover and secure their homes and fetch emergence water, ice food and tarps provided by Hawaii County and private sources.

Precincts 1 and 2 were not open 8/9/2014 because they did have any electric . Precincts 3 and 4 did have electric and were open 8/9/2014. Precincts 3 and 4 should have then been reopened in Pahoia, 8/15/2014 in order to accommodate the qualified voters of these two Precincts that could not arrive there 8/9/2014 because of Eselle Storm and H2O gas release of PGV, and included in the Continuance of Primary Voting of 8/15/2014 when Precincts 1 and 2 were open, both Precincts 1 and 2 consolidated in Precinct 2 Keonepoko School, Hawaiian Beaches.

State of Office of Elections refused to let all of these Qualified Voters of Precincts 3 and 4 vote in the 8/15/2014 Primary Continuance of 8/15/2014. These disenfranchised qualified Voters must be given the opportunity to vote in the 2014 Primary Election in Puna Hawaii.

This avoidance of allowing people to vote is absolutely unacceptable to all of us here in the Puna area that defend our US Constitutional Rights To Vote.

We consider the actions of Scott Nago here to be criminal and tell you remove Scott Nago from the employment of the Hawaii Office of Elections before the forthcoming General Election in November 2014.

An Act of Nature is not any reason to deny qualified Voters their US Constitutional Rights To Vote
