

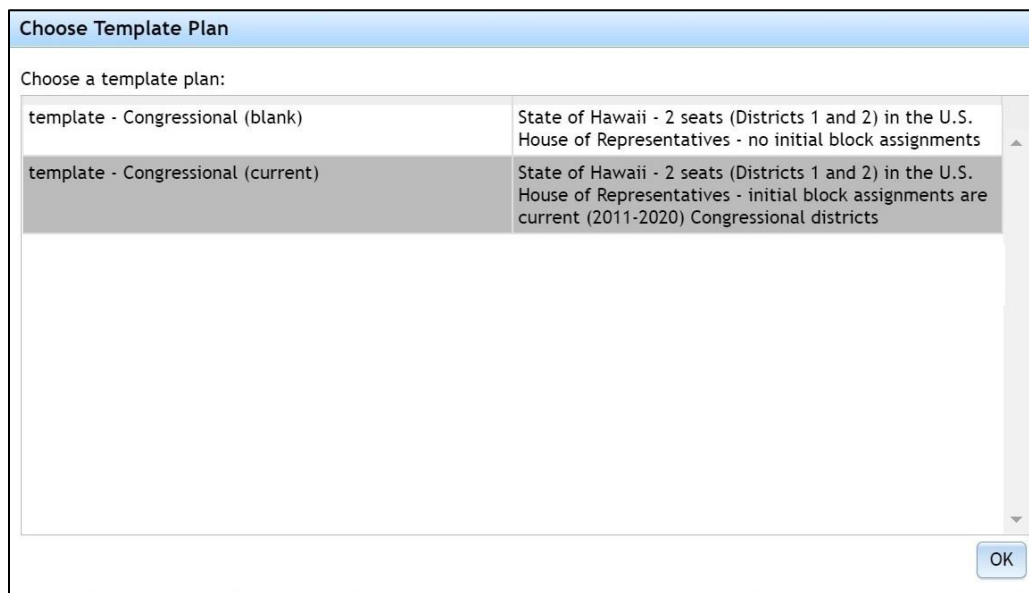


Hawaii Redistricting Online assists the Hawaii Reapportionment Commission, Advisory Councils, advocacy groups, and the public to create state legislative and congressional redistricting plans following the 2020 U.S. Census.

At the time the video was made there were only two template plans to choose from:



These two template plans were for redistricting Hawaii Congressional districts. One plan was named “(blank)”, meaning no census blocks are assigned to a district. The other plan was named “(current)”, meaning the census blocks are assigned to their current (2011-2020) districts. Both templates use the Federal Population Base of P.L. 94-171 resident population block-level counts.

On September 9, 2021, the Hawaii Reapportionment Commission approved the Hawaii Population Base of permanent residents to be used for Step 1 – Reapportionment:

Using the number of seats apportioned to each Basic Island Unit, we can calculate the ideal (target) population for each Basic Island Unit:

We can see that while the individual targets for Senate and for House vary widely, when viewed in totality (76 seats representation) they are quite similar, a total deviation of only 0.55%.

For Step 2 – Redistricting, we need to compare the population of each district in a Basic Island Unit with the ideal (target) population for that Basic Island Unit. Using the current (2011-2012) district boundaries, we can calculate the overall (total) deviation for each Basic Island Unit:

Overall Plan Deviation Summary	
U.S. House	0.60% deviation
State Senate Oahu	30.72% deviation
State Senate Hawaii	15.15% deviation
State Senate Maui	14.33% deviation
State House Oahu	56.17% deviation
State House Hawaii	16.21% deviation
State House Maui	15.73% deviation
State House Kauai	4.64% deviation

The overall (total) deviation for State Senate and State House should be less than 10%. As you can see, most are currently well above that threshold.

This where the job of redistricting begins. We need to move district boundaries by assigning census blocks and their associated population to different districts to bring the overall (total) deviation below 10%.


Hawaii Redistricting Online has a set of tools to help you do this. Most users find it easiest to start with the current district boundaries and adjust census blocks from there. Some users like to start from a blank map with no census blocks assigned. So, similar to the Congressional template plans shown earlier, there are template plans for State Senate and for State House for each Basic Island Unit, both blank and current:

- Hawaii State House (blank) and (current)
- Hawaii State Senate (blank) and (current)
- Kauai State House (blank) and (current)
- Maui State House (blank) and (current)
- Maui State Senate (blank) and (current)
- Oahu State House (blank) and (current)
- Oahu State Senate (blank) and (current)

When you start Hawaii Redistricting Online you will now see these template plans in the “Choose Template Plan window:

template - Maui State Senate (current)	Maui Basic Island Unit - 3 seats (Districts 5 thru 7) in the Hawaii State Senate - initial block assignments are current (2012-2020) State Senate districts
template - Oahu State House (blank)	Oahu Basic Island Unit - 35 seats (Districts 17 thru 51) in the Hawaii State House - no initial block assignments
template - Oahu State House (current)	Oahu Basic Island Unit - 35 seats (Districts 17 thru 51) in the Hawaii State House - initial block assignments are current (2012-2020) State House districts

If you click on the column title “Plan Name” (red arrow shows where), you will see the listed sorted alphabetically as shown above.

Click on the template plan you want to start with and click “OK”. The plan will open and you’re ready to start redistricting!
