1. On the primary elections ballot the box for Nonpartisan Ballot has to be removed from the list of the political parties. "Nonpartisan Ballot" is NOT a party. This design error is causing disenfranchising of the majority of Hawaii registered voters. Majority of voters are nonpartisan because they don't associate with any party platforms and wish <u>NOT to be stating their party preference</u> as a condition for their voting (as granted to them by Hawaii constitution 12:32 section).

Aloha Elections Commission Chair Curtis and Elections Commission Members,

This past August 10 Primary election had the lowest voter turnout since statehood.

On August 11th news reporter Eddie Dowd interviewed people asking, "Did you know Hawaii had an election on August 10th?" and posted the video on social media.

The comments were discouraging.

Many people not only reported that they weren't aware of the election, but that they never received a ballot.

I asked the question on social media, "Did you get a ballot?" and had similar replies.

Here are the responses from the social media posts (names have been withheld for privacy):

- 1. "I got mine, plus 5 extra for people in my family who no longer live here"
- 2. I'm registered and I voted in person. I did move house but I forwarded my mail"
- 3. "I have lived at the same address for over 50 years [did not get a ballot]"
- 4. "I didn't get one voted in person"
- 5. "My family didn't get any [ballots]...I just checked and we're registered"
- 6. "I did not get one"
- 7. "I got one for my dad who passed away 3 years ago"
- 8. "I didn't get one"
- 9. "My wife and I didn't get any [ballots]"
- 10."I did not get one"
- 11. "I never got a ballot or anything telling me where to vote?"
- 12. "Never got mine in the mail and because it was on a Saturday, I work and couldn't go down to an actual poll"

- 13. "I didn't get a ballot in the mail, but I know elections are in August so I looked up the date online and went in person"
- 14. "I never received my mail in ballot"
- 15. "My husband didn't get his...I got mine tho (sic)...Also when we went to the Kaneohe voting station they told us it was closed and we had to put our ballot n the box outside...and because my husband didn't get his in the mail he didn't get to vote"
- 16. "I didn't get anything?"
- 17. "I didn't get mine in the mail. Don't just assume people got their ballot in the mail. I live in an area that has a large homeless community that just helps themselves to what is in our mailbox and property when we are away at work and children in school"
- 18. "We got ours but also got one for a deceased relative (passed away 6 years ago)"
- 19. "I don't think I received one"

How many people did not receive ballots and were thus disenfranchised?

When Representative Diamond Garcia went to the Office of Elections in May to file his candidacy paperwork he was told his voter registration was inactive, despite not having moved. Curious if this had happened to other registered voters, myself and another Hawaii Republican Party volunteer contacted some people who voted in person in our party primary in March and asked them to check their voter registration to see if they had been switched to inactive.

Adriel Lam sent a letter to the City Clerk's office with the names of those who replied that they had been switched to inactive and asked that this be investigated. As of August 23, 2024, he has not received a reply.

I humbly ask the Elections Commission to request from the Chief Elections Officer and each of the city and county clerks the Business Reply Mail (BRM) receipts from USPS for the August 2024 primary mail ballots, and the voter registration lists from each county that were submitted to the ballot printers, to start an investigation into how so many voters appear to not have received ballots and/or had their voter registration status switched to inactive, despite not changing their residence or mailing address.

I respectfully request that the Election Commission terminate the employment and investigate Election Officer Scott Nago. The Commission should refer the details of extensive citizen testimony regarding felony, fraud, and obstruction to the appropriate authorities, as required under the law.

Scott Nago, the Chief Elections Officer of Hawaii, has been involved in several election-related controversies, legal cases, and investigations.

Below are some key points found with simple online search to 2011 followed by recent testimony by citizens of failure to respond and inconsistencies with ballot security:

Please acknowledge this and reply so that I know you are forwarding this the email to the commission. I would also like this email and the attachment to be included in the next Election Commission meeting under Communications & Correspondence.

I have been attending the meetings for about 2+ years, including all the meetings in 2024. I wanted to make a few points and a request.

During all of these meetings with Chair Curtis as Chair, it is an obvious observation that Chair Curtis is antagonistic to Commissioner Cushine for reasons not understood. His behavior towards Mr. Cushine during the last meeting on June 19th was outright disgraceful and was definitely a violation of decorum.

In my opinion, Commissioner Cushine brings issues to the table that needs attention; things the <u>legitimate</u> voting base has been asking for, for 4 years. The past Commission has failed the people by not addressing concerns. The new Commissioners on this Commission are at least trying to address these concerns, and yet there is push-back. Why? From my point of view, it looks very suspicious.

It is obvious that a handful of the same commissioners tend to vote opposite of whatever the testifiers want, without ever justifying their vote. **Do the commissioners in question have an allegiance to anyone other than the people they swore an oath to serve?**

The people that are eligible to vote in Hawaii have been very concerned about the elections: the machines and "proprietary" software from a 3-party vender (Hart); technology - hardware and software not understood by Election officials nor the Election Commission; the Election Office not conducting the post-election audits as required by law; he mail-in ballots being sent to everyone on the voter rolls, the voter rolls being bloated and grossly inaccurate; the lack the chain of custody of the mail-in ballots, for both for the drop box and post office return; lack of maintenance of the voter roll; the 10-day election "season", which is an unnecessary cost to the tax-payers in Hawaii and a waste of time and resources that could otherwise be used to run a 1-day election; the centralized counting center, not accessible to the public, who have a right, by law, to watch the count happen.

All these issues have been ignored by Scott Nago and some members of the Election Commission.

The people have spoken. They want Scott Nago gone. On June 19th, Election Commission voted to remove Mr. Nago and the vote to remove him passed. The 100 people on the call understand this was legitimate vote. The Deputy Attorney General also understands this was legitimate vote. The only one who does not is Chair Curtis. He does not have this authority to determine what is legitimate; he is there to facilitate the meeting.

Why does Commissioner Curtis want Mr. Nago to stay in this the CEO position, when Mr. Nago has done so poorly by the voters of Hawaii? Does Commissioner Curtis have an allegiance to anyone other than the people he swore an oath to serve?

During the last meeting, two testifiers spoke during their allotted 3 minutes. These two men, James V. and Clint Curtis (no relation to Chair Curtis I believe?), spoke with authority about technology used in the Hawaii Elections. These two should have a special presentation time for the July meeting, because their expertise would be very beneficial to the commission, since the commissioners have, on many occasions admitted that they are not equipped to understand the technology side of our elections. I would like these two men, if they are willing to come back, to have time to explain to the commission how this technology works; let the commissioners understand what experts say about the current technology before determining if this machinery is conducive to free and fair elections (from a source other than Scott Nago's office if you please - conflict of interest there). This is especially important for the commissioners who do not want to look deeper into the machine/tech side of our* elections.

The bottom line is this: <u>Our elections are not transparent</u>. The legitimate voters want 1-day voting in precincts (i.e. local neighborhoods), paper ballots and hand counting there at the precinct while the people watch! They want those results to stand and to be sent from that location up to the subsequent, district, county and state counts – the simple process as it was conducted in

the past. A simple, 1-day vote will produce the results well before 10 pm on election night. <u>The common talking point is that there</u> needs to be legislation to do so. Not true. The Election office has room to implement elections in this manner within the language of the law and the constitution – which says Election Day, not election 2-weeks.

NO MORE BS. The elections as they stand now are a waste of time and resources and bring lots of suspicion. People do not trust that our elections are truly free and fair.

Please share this letter with all of the commissioners.

Aloha State Election Commissioners

My civic engagement includes being a Maui County Charter Commissioner, and director of a political action committee, the Maui Pono Network. I was also an election observer for the primary and general election for 2022 and used my 24-year experience as a systems engineer consultant. My comments are on the primary areas of vulnerability which are focused on the hired contractor and state process and a simple solution:

I Hundreds of free-floating thumb drives are used to record the data from each voting machine at the polls and transfers the data on these drives directly to the computer run by the contractor.

- Thumb Drives can be lost or misplaced.
- Any digital device can be hacked. Even encrypted drives.
- These thumb drives are used to upload votes into the computer. They do not use the paper ballots that are printed at the polls, that are safely removed and stored.

II Having worked with election integrity computer experts I can assure you that any digital device can be hacked. This opens questions regarding outside contractor counters.

- Despite calibration and testing prior to the count, the testing during the run and selected brief hand count, vulnerability can occur even remotely.
- The secured paper ballots are kept by the county, yet we rely on a contractor and the state to give us the result.
- Basically, the counties give control of their elections to a contractor and the state.

III The elections data in the hands of the contractor is transferred electronically by the contractor from Maui to Oahu where their tabulators come up with the elections results. Only after the state goes through our elections results do the voters receive it. There are several checks, yet vulnerability exists.

- Transfer of the data electronically is susceptible, despite the claims by the contractor.
- The state tabulators can be hacked remotely. I have seen it done for Alaska.
- The county has all the paper ballots, yet we rely on a system with many potential vulnerabilities.

IV The solution is simple at hardly no cost and any additional staff.

• The county holds the paper ballots for 22 month, this data is not impacted by the contractors or state digital exchanges.

- Maui county election crews are well-trained, experienced and they run a tight ship. They check and organize the paper ballots and assure each ballot is considered.
- All the paper ballots are assembled in the Maui County Chambers and there is plenty of room for two county owned counters.
- There is a lot of down time between counting runs and a crew of two can do an independent county run. These counters run about \$35,000 each and can be purchased directly from the manufacturer.

A simple solution is empowering a county to run a check on all the data moving around in digital form. It provides much greater voter confidence. It does not affect communication or voting results broadcasts as it will still come from the state. Those in the county chambers do not have phones so the county check will be only that and will not broadcast election results. There is no disruption to the overall process, requires no additional staff, and it would help resolve 12 areas of vulnerability and concern.

Dear Michael Curtis, Elections Commission Chair

In recent passing of Act 027, which "allows the Chief Election Officer to use accurate copies of paper ballots, rather than the originals, when conducting a precinct audit of an electronic voting system's tally." How does the Chief Election Officer assure the accurate copies of paper ballots are in fact "accurate"?

I understand the urgency to modernize post-election audit procedures; however, accuracy over efficiency is of the utmost importance when it comes to elections. After all, the ability to vote for an elected official is the heart of democracy.

To confirm the results and ensure the accuracy and integrity of the election, I believe HRS (3) in its original form, was enacted to assure the electronic tallies created directly by electronic voting systems equaled the hand tallies of the paper ballots.

A functioning example of HRS §16-42(b)(3) occurred in the 2022 General Election when West Hawaii County GOP Chair, Dalene McCormick, requested a hand tallied paper ballot audit of one full precinct on the Big Island. The results of that audit revealed that electronic images were faulty, and inaccurately counted votes as an "Overvote" for then US Senate candidate Brian Schatz when the voter clearly meant to vote for said person.

My concern is centered around the formal process of voting where accuracy should supersede efficiency to avoid an abandonment of democracy. The Chief Election Officer, Scott Nago, stated in a testimony on February 1, 2024 that they found more human errors in the 2022 election due to the ballots at the voter service centers needing to be first sorted manually by district/precinct. I would presume parameters were set in place to avoid or intercept said errors on the assumption that all ballots are being sorted and stored by district/precinct.

Aloha Chair Curtis and members of the Elections Commission,

Congratulations to the new Commission members and thank you for the opportunity to provide testimony regarding the conduct of elections in Hawaii this soon after the Aug 10, 2024 Primary Election.

I provided my first testimony to the Election Commission on Jan 12, 2022. Since, then I've seen some improvements and corrections made, in no small part to the hard work and dedication of the election workers and volunteers. Many of my fellow concerned citizens have and will continue to testify to the matters that concern them to include chain of custody, key control, ballot box security, voter roll maintenance and adherence to the letter and spirit of the law for post-election, pre-certification audits in accordance with HRS 16-42 (b)(3). Today, I return to one my original issues of concern and a few observations from the 2024 Primary.

- 1. In the 2020 General Election, I raised the issue of UNITED STATES HAWAII (first, middle, and last name) being registered to vote in Kaneohe, HI. No such person is known to reside, receive mail or receive a ballot at this registered address, but still managed to record a VOTE BY MAIL in the 2020 General Election. For this ballot to have counted, what was the name on the ballot envelope and what signature was used to match this record?
- 2. As a candidate in the 2024 Primary Election, I was made aware of 2024 Primary Election ballot count data posted online as of Aug 1, 2024, ten days before the Primary Election. The publisher said this data was electronically sourced from the Office of Elections. In the attached file, the published article (and now deleted online, but attached for your reference) was an old write-up from 2022, but included data tables with 2024 candidates and ballot data (starting on page 7). The Office of Elections, the Attorney General, and Prosecuting Attorney were made aware of this information being made public on Aug 8, 2024. Was there any investigation, corrective action or due diligence made on the part of any government official as to the propriety and legality of such data being published before an election contest was complete?
- 3. Elections By Mail has again failed to deliver on the promises of increasing voter turnout and lowering costs. The historic low turnout of 32.3% is not only deflated by the excess of inactive, outdated and dead voter registrations, but highlights a disparate impact of voter information and voter access to elections.

- a. KITV reported on Election Day the lack of voter participation <u>https://www.hawaiinewsnow.com/video/2024/08/11/election-officials-report-low-voter-turnout-2024-primary-election/</u>
- b. Yet, an online poll of Star Advertiser subscribers shows a vastly different participation rate, see attached screenshot.
- c. The data compiled from Office of Election precinct details, shows a wide variance of precinct turnout of mailed ballots from 1.6% to 51.9%, see attached spreadsheet.

As of this moment, I'm still waiting for the Credit Data file, or commonly known as the AB file, for the Aug 10, 2024 Primary Election. Usually it is available upon request, but 17 days after the election I'm still waiting for the final list of ballots that were returned to the Counties. Ultimately, the election of public officials are determined upon the consent of the governed. It is not only in the number of the ballots cast, but also trust in how the ballots have been counted. HRS 16-24 still provides for the public count of paper ballots, as well as the order and method to do so in HRS 16-25. The Election Commission can do much to restore public trust and confidence in our elections by returning to tried and true methods of HRS 16-24 and HRS 16-25.

UPDATE: All voting data is through the third printout released at 4:40 a.m. Wednesday.

Hawai'i County will have more representation in the State Legislature with one additional House seat created in January due to the increase in the island's population. Early votes show incumbents on the Big Island will keep their seats. Democratic Kirstin Kahaloa also was the apparent winner for the newly created District 6 seat.

District 3: Includes Keaukaha, parts of Hilo, Pana'ewa and Waiākea

Democrat Chris Todd, the state representative for District 2 from 2017 until 2022, received 5,182 votes (72.1%). Aloha 'Āina challenger Devinshaw McMackin of Hilo tallied 1,226 votes (17%).

On Tuesday night, Todd said he was happy there was representation from the Aloha 'Āina Party. While he didn't know his opponent, he said he respected him for keeping the campaign positive.

"I'm not someone very attached to the two party system and it was good to give voters other options," Todd said.

With the redistricting, he said it's a fantastic opportunity to provide representation to Puna, which for the first time will have three lawmakers representing the area.

"It will level the playing field and provide more attention to that area," Todd said

While the outcome of the race is slightly disappointing, McMacklin said the work doesn't end: "I'm still going to advocate for equal pay and housing."

District 4: Includes Hawaiian Paradise Park, Hawaiian Beaches, Koae, Kapoho, Pohoiki, Leilani Estates and Kehena

Democrat incumbent Greggor Ilagan will keep his seat, receiving 4,832 votes (67.2%), easily outdistancing second-place finisher Rep. Ho Keikilani, who had 1,607 votes (22.3%).

Ilagan has served as state representative for District 4 since 2020. Previously, he was elected to the Hawai'i County Council in 2012 and 2014, chairing the Planning and Housing committees and a member of the Finance and Public Works committee.

"I'm overwhelmed with happiness and greatly appreciative of the voters," llagan said. "It's great to be back in politics and I appreciate the kindness of the candidates and running a clean campaign."

The easy part, Ilagan said, is winning the election. Now it's the hard part of delivering the work for the people. The representative invited his constituents in Puna to visit him during town hall meetings he's scheduled in December.

Ho, the executive director at Melaleuca: The Wellness Company and a mother of three, congratulated Ilagan on his victory.

"Personally, I wanted to give the community an option, and as a mother I have a deep concern about many issues in this state, and in our district," Ho said Tuesday night. "I ran to help bring common sense and compassionate solutions that support the community's dayto-day life." Nonpartisan Brian Ley received 354 votes (4.9%). Libertarian Party Candace Linton received 155 votes (2.2%).

District 5: Includes Kea'au, Kurtistown, Mountain View, Glenwood, Volcano, Pāhala, Punalu'u, Nā'ālehu, Miloli'i, Ho'opuloa, Ho'okena and Pawaina

Mike Last

Democrat Jeanné Kapela will keep her seat with 4,954 votes (65%). She is the first woman and Native Hawaiian to represent her district. As part of the redistricting, she will also now represent portions of Puna.

"I am just filled with gratitude for the opportunity to continue to serve my community," Kapela said.

The representative added she is excited to tackle challenges that will come nationally, including women's reproductive rights.

"As we know Hawai'i has been a historically pro-choice state," she said. "We have to buckle down and increase access to health care.

Kapela said Puna is a medical desert where there is a lack of services.

"We need to fix that along with housing," she said. "Everyone deserves a roof over their head and it's the job of the legislature to ensure that."

Republican Lohi Goodwin came in second with 1,926 votes (25.3%). He said the results of Tuesday's election weren't unexpected.

"A lot of the local people are disenfranchised by this whole process," Goodwin said. "I don't think this vote reflects the values of the community but it's who shows up."

Despite the loss, Goodwin said he will continue to be active in the community.

"I'm not done with this yet," he said.

Libertarian Party candidate Mike Last, a retired electrical engineering consultant, received 249 votes (3.3%).

District 6: Includes Hōnaunau, Napoʻopoʻo, Captain Cook, Kealakekua, Keauhou, Hōlualoa and Kailua-Kona

Using data from the U.S. Census, the district boundaries are re-evaluated every 10 years. As a result of the 2020 census, boundaries were moved to make room for an additional seat: District 6. There are now eight representative seats in Hawai'i County.

Democrat Kirstin Kahaloa will be the first to represent District 6 with 5,405 votes (63.1%). Kahaloa, president and past president for Hawai'i Island Native Hawaiian Chamber of Commerce, said she is thrilled Hawai'i Island gets an additional voice. "I'm thrilled, honored, humbled and overwhelmed in a good way," Kahaloa said. "I'm excited to get to work immediately."

Kahaloa said she's eager to hear from the community about their needs and what legislation can help the district. Last legislative session, there was a fund created for universal preschool and Kahaloa said she wants to make sure it gets used for that purpose.

Republican challenger Jonathan Kennealy captured 2,641 votes (30.8%). He is a graduate of Waiakea High School and joined the army as a military police soldier on active duty. He served all over the world and throughout the U.S. as a federal police officer.

District 8: Includes Hawī, Waiaka, Waimea, Makahalau, Palihooukapapa, Waikii, Waikōloa, Waikui, Kawaihae and Mahukona

Democrat David Tarnas will keep his seat, receiving 5,553 votes (65.8%).

Tarnas served as state representative for House District 6 from 1994-1998 and as state representative for House District 7 from 2018-2022. He is a member of the Waimea Community Association; South Kohala Traffic Safety Committee; Waikoloa Community Leadership Council; North Kohala Community Access Group; Pohakuloa Training Area Community Advisory Group; Hawaii County Agricultural Advisory Commission; former chair, Hawaii County Democratic Party; and flutist with the Hulihee Palace Band.

"I'm grateful I can continue to serve as state representative," Rep. Tarnas said. "I'm looking forward to working with the new administration."

Tarnas said he hopes to remain chair of the water and land committee so he can continue to address water shed and coastal issues.

Republican Monique Perreira, a licensed massage therapist, garnered 2,477 votes (29.3%).

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

Scott Nago, Head of the Office of Elections, must be removed from his position as he has shown numerous times he has no integrity and does not honor the election process.

Reasons for his termination include, but not limited to the following:

- Federal law requires an Election Officer (Scott Nago) to retain, preserve, and maintain control over & access to the Cast Vote Records for 22 months following an election. He states that, before the 22 months concluded, he lost access and could not provide citizens with those records. **This is a federal felony.**
- An eye witness told Mr. Nago that there was a potential connection to the internet at the election station (which is illegal AND makes the results vulnerable to manipulation). Nago disregarded the witness's concern. The County Clerk called the police on the witness. Other observes vouched for the witness and the police left. However. Scott Nago sent the witness an email, removing him as an Election Observer. Nago had no right to do that!

Coordinated takedown... instead called the police on him.

- Numerous citizens complained to Mr. Nago about concerns they had with election integrity and he ignored them completely.
- Mr. Nago failed to correctly inform the Election Commission during the June 2024 meeting of retention/preservation, appearing to suggest that records could not be accessed until AFTER the 22 month period.

I request that the Commission **terminate** the employment of at-will employee Election Officer Scott Nago and refer the details of extensive citizen testimony regarding felony, fraud, obstruction, etc., to appropriate legal authorities, as required under the law.

Scott Nago, Head of the office of elections must be removed and all the complaints against him investigated. He and those who have directed or approved of his numerous illegal actions must be held accountable fully under the law.

There are dozens of issues have been raised about our elections and they have it seems been universally swept under the rug; the court has refused to hear over 30 lawsuits alleging numerous lawful violations and Nago continues to be employed in this office! The insecurity of voting machines and the ease of manipulating mail in ballots must be addressed honestly and lawfully. Elections are sacred contracts. We must have the utmost integrity and transparency in this process!

I know that others will list some specifics, they are already well documented and available as court filings that were not heard by our courts there are also copious other complaints by voters.

Please remove him and investigate immediately and prosecute to the fullest extent of the law wherever that truth leads.
